The Scenic Route

Follow Highway 207 out of Cole Harbour along the coast past Lawrencetown Beach, one of the premier surfing spots in Nova Scotia. The road winds past stunning headlands and ocean views. Take note of the Acadian architecture and beautiful salt marshes in West Chezzetcook. Many of the place-names in Nova Scotia and along the Eastern Shore are Mi'kmaq in origin. For example, Musquodoboit Harbour was originally *Muskoodeboogwek*, which roughly translates to "rolling in foam" or "foaming to the sea."
